

LEARNING THROUGH PLAY



- Research
- Planned and purposeful environment
- Planning and responding in the moment



- 'In play a child always behaves beyond his average age, above his daily behaviour. In play it is as though he were a head taller than himself.' (Vygotsky)
- 'Almost all creativity involves purposeful play.' (Abraham Maslow)

How Do We Get To Know Your Child?

- Talking to the nursery s/he attended
- Look at the children's records from another setting
- Talking to you about the things they can do
- Talking to your child
- Playing alongside your child
- Watching your child playing and talking to others





FOCUS CHILDREN

- Focus Children Rota based on birthdays (approx 3-4 children a week) x 2 times a year
- Parents will be asked to fill in a *Interests and Events at Home* information sheet
- · Parent consultations will take place the week after your child has been a focus
- Your child's progress and next steps will be recorded and their observations and achievements will be shared with you on Tapestry



PROUD BOOKS

- Your child will have their own book in which we will collect their writing, maths and creative work.
- We will also collect the stories that your child makes up themselves (Story Scribing).
